Purpose and objectives of discipline	To form students' philosophical thinking - an idea of the theoretical and applied features of philosophical knowledge; about the history of philosophical thought, about the world system and the processes of globalization, the processes of modern society and its main areas.

	-to consider the features of the methodology of modern philosophical knowledge;

	- to study the main spheres of society and their interrelation with regard to their current state.								
Course description	This is course is a survey of several major areas of Western analytic philosophy: metaphysics and epistemology, ethics, philosophy of mind, philosophy of language, philosophy of religion, and philosophy of science. Students explore such								

	concepts as the nature of the world and how we have access to							
	knowledge of the world; moral behavior and the nature of good							
	and evil; the relationship between minds and bodies; the							
	relationship between our thoughts and the external world;							
	arguments for and against the existence of God; and how we							
	should employ logical analysis and empirical observations to							
	evaluate arguments.
